### **About Go Green and Textile Recycling**

Go Green's vision is working with environmentally concerned merchants and the community to end the flood of clothing streaming into our landfills. Despite the efforts of many noble charities, according to the EPA, the United States recycles only 16% of all clothing, shoes, and similar textile goods. We hope you will pitch in and donate your unwanted clothing, shoes, and other textiles to support this community recycling and fundraising drive!

### **GO GREEN RECYCLING WILL PUT YOUR RECYCLE ITEMS TO GOOD USE**

Clothing too worn or stained to wear is graded into a variety of categories. Cotton may be made into rags or form a component for new paper. Knitted or woven woollens and similar materials are "pulled" in fibrous state for reuse by the textile industry. Other types of fabric can be reprocessed into fibers for upholstery, insulation, and even building materials. Quality clothing and shoes are processed and resold as a donation for *Mission For All Nations*.
